Annual Report 2009-10

OBSERVATION OF NATIONAL ENVIRONMENT DAY:

On 1st March 2009 National Environment Day was celebrated on the theme "Protection of Environment". A mass rally was organized by our society in the village of Pendoria Sultanpur Uttar Pradesh to promote the youth and villagers. Amethi coordinator Ram Karan Chauhan organized a conference after rally and aware villagers to use the jute bags and replace the polythene with paper bags, wooden bags and use the paper on both sides.

In the program he tells the villagers to use the toilets and not use the fields for toilet. After toilet he said wash the hands with soap. Plant more and more trees around you. Trees help you to protect your environment and get fresh air free from pollution.

OBSERVATION OF INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY:

On 11th March 2009 International Women's Day was celebrated as "*Nari Shaktikaran*".



On this an open discussion between women organized at Munshiganj center, Uttar Pradesh India. Many women take part in this activity to discuss how we can improve our economic status and would be self dependent. On this day a small training camp is also organized for 2 days where they learn tie-die, painting, Soft-Toys with pattern cutting and guidance of marketing are given. Through this training women are excited in the villages.

OBSERVATION OF PREVENTION OF BLINDNESS WEEK:

On 1st April 2009 Prevention of blindness week was celebrated with a campaign "*Careful for sight*". Sight is important in our life without sight the world becomes useless. In this week volunteer campaign in different blocks of Sultanpur such as Amethi, Bhetwa, Bhadar, Sangrampur Gauriganj, Sahgargh. In this campaign volunteers told them what is cataract and how it affects us and their symptoms.

They tell about vision may become blurry or dim because the cataract stops light from properly passing through to your retina. Cataracts are a leading cause of blindness among older adults. Cataracts can also sometimes be found in young people or even newborn babies. They tell there are also several possible risk factors for cataracts, such as:

-Intense heat or long-term exposure to UV rays from the sun

-Certain diseases, such as diabetes

-Inflammation in the eye

-Hereditary influences

-Events before birth, such as German measles in the mother

-Long-term steroid use

-Eye injuries

-Eye diseases

-Smoking

Main symptoms are cataract does not cause pain, redness or tears. The following problems may indicate that you have a cataract:

- You have blurred vision, double vision, ghost images, or the sense of a "film" over your eyes.
- Lights seem too dim for reading or close-up work, or you are "dazzled" by strong light.
- You change eyeglass prescriptions often and the change does not seem to help your vision.
You may also be able to see the cataract in your eye. It may look like a milky or yellowish spot in your pupil.

The key to preventing vision loss is regular eye exams. If you are 65 or older, you should get a complete eye exam every one or two years, even if you have no problem seeing well. Be sure to ask your eye doctor for a dilated eye exam.

OBSERVATION OF PANCHAYAT DAY:

On 24th April 2009 Panchayat Diwas was celebrated with a theme "Awareness of laws for Panchayat". This programme is organized in the village of Saraykhema by our society. In this programme our state co-coordinator Manoj srivastava tells the villagers about The Mahatma Gandhi National Employment Guarantee Scheme in which all villagers can make job guarantee card by Pradhan and get 100 days job in the village itself. Wages of all work is given to all villages through their own account opened in bank of nearest branch. He also tells them about Rules and laws of Panchayati raj in which 33% seats are reserved for women's.

OBSERVATION OF INTERNATIONAL LABOUR DAY:

On 1st May 2009 International labour Day was celebrated with a theme "Campaign on Anti-Child Labour". On this day our state co-coordinator organizes an mass march in the village of Tandwa Block Shahgargh Sultanpur for awareness of Child labour Prohibition and Regulation Act 1986 under which there is Ban on Child Labour in homes, restaurant and hotels. He tells special Child welfare Commission is made who look after relative work with child welfare. He tells the employers face charges under section 374 (unlawful compulsory labour) of IPC and section 26(exploitation of a juvenile) of the JJ Act. Employers required to fine 20000 for every child employed.

CACL will attempt to identify children being employed under the age of 14 years and forward complaints to the District Collector and appropriate Labour department authorities. Questions were also raised about the validity of the State Government's figures on child labour, the officials seemed to depend on the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan statistics of over 25,000 child workers and all plans to eradicate child labour hinged on this estimate.

OBSERVATION OF ANTI-TOBACCO DAY:

On 31st May 2009 Ant- Tobacco Day was celebrated on the theme "Alert with Gutakha" by organizing campaign awareness program in all primary schools of Amethi Uttar-Pradesh, India and through this campaign SAHASH volunteers told the students, how chewing Gutakha are harmful to our health and how it can cause a Cancer. Use of Gutakha increases the chance of developing cancer of oral cavity, food pipe stomach intestine, overy, mouth and throat, breast, liver, blood and other organs. Our co-coordinator told the students not to use the Gutakha because it cancer. SAHASH volunteers told the students symptoms of cancer which is caused by this tobacco such as

- Bloody discharge from urinary channel and private parts.
- Any swelling in the breast or other parts of the body.
- Continuous cough /change in voice /difficulty in breathing.
- Difficulty in swelling /sudden loss of weight /loss of appetite.
- Wound, which is not healing?
- Change in daily bowel/bladder habits.

Our volunteers tell the students in campaign how you quite the smoking & Gutakha.

1. If you smoke under stress at work, pick a date when you are away from work.
2. Decide whether you are going to stop suddenly or gradually. If it is to be gradual, work out a tapering system so that you have immediate goals on your way to an 'I Quit' day.
3. Don't store up cigarettes. Never buy by the carton. Wait until one pack is finished before you buy another.
4. Never carry cigarettes around with you at home or at work. Keep them as far away as possible. Leave them with someone or lock them up.
5. Until you quit, make a smoking corner that is far away from anything interesting.
6. Never smoke while watching television.
7. If you like to smoke with others, try smoking alone. If you like smoking alone, try to find the company of people who do not smoke.
8. Never carry matches or lighters around with you.

OBSERVATION OF WORD ENVIRONMENT DAY:

On 5th June 2009 Word Environment Day, SAHASH organized a camp in Semra Primary school, Sultanpur Uttar-Pradesh to aware the villagers to aware them about the environment. Co-coordinator of Amethi tells the villagers that it is necessary to control the pollution; it can be controlled by planting more trees.



about 20 trees of mango, neem and ashok.

Trees are only responsible for pollution free environment. He tells that trees release oxygen and absorbed Carbon di-oxide and help us to sustain life. We can give contribution in control pollution and protect the environment by using car pool, ban plastics bags and cups. Switch off the stand by electronics .Develop waste management and rain harvesting system, run an in house e-club. All volunteers and villagers planted

On 11th July 2009 World Population Day was celebrated with family planning campaign. On this day open discussion is done at village Washwapur Uttar-Pradesh state co-coordinator Manoj Srivastava introduced with the help of local Health center Nurse about the family planning and what are care and awareness program done by the government to promote the family planning. He also tell the what is the benefits of the family planning and how all of you able to manage the small family with good education, health and wealth.

OBSERVATION OF WORLD LITERACY DAY:

On 08th Sep 2009 World Literacy Day was celebrated on the theme “No-illiteracy” SAHASH Campaign and organize a small rally in the villages to aware the villagers that they have to think on education and send all child’s in school.



According to the District Level Household and Facility Survey of the Ministry of Health, Government of India, 37 per cent girls in Uttar Pradesh are married before the age of 18. Apart from this, 60 per cent of the women who are married are illiterate. The 2001 Census had highlighted that the literacy rate for women in UP was 42.98 per cent.

As SAHASH launches the project KHEL-KHEL MAI PADHAI in Amethi at village Kadergaun to educate the children from age of 2 yrs to 5 yrs. It is continued as a formal education in the villages.

OBJECTIVE OF KHEL-KHEL MAI PADHAI

To educate the children of villages from the age of 2 yrs to 5 yrs through toys ,charts and models. SAHASH gives the confidence among the villagers that their children are at the same level as children of metro cities.

SILENT FEATURES OF KHEL-KHEL MAI PADHAI

We educate the children through different programs and cultural activities, so that they motivate towards education. Our volunteers go to guardian's house to report the progress of their child. Continuous meetings are organized with guardians. To accompany with govt. & private school teachers we provide a facility to the children who crossed the age of 05 years in reference of education. We organize monthly staff meeting for checking the progress of this project.

A rally was organized by Ram Karan co-coordinator- Amethi Uttar Pradesh and Uma Shankar co-ordinator Kurushetra Haryana to achieve the vision of **ENDPOVERTY 2015**.

Students in school taken a pledge and call an slogan "**Stand up Against Poverty**".

OBSERVATION OF CHILDREN RIGHTS DAY:

On 20th Nov 2009 Children Rights Day was celebrated by organizing a Debate competition in Primary school Katergaon, Sultanpur Uttar-Pradesh with a theme "Children Rights" by Amethi coordinator Ram Karan. His motto was to aware the children first, and villagers about children rights and rules implemented by the government.

OBSERVATION POLLUTION PROTECTION DAY:

On 2nd Dec 2009 Pollution protection day observed to create awareness about pollution and its affect on health. Different types of pollution such as Air, Water and Sound can affect us in different form of disease. So we should be careful about them. Trees directly help us in the form of fruit, wood and medicinal purposes as well as they absolved carbon di-oxide and release oxygen which we inhale and helpful for life. In Uttar-Pradesh trees are only planted in 21722 square km (9.01%of geographical area).Most of the villagers depend on the trees for different daily necessities such as energy and Animal Husbandry. Unbalance environment increases the temperature or changes the monsoon which affect the society. If we have not taken a certain step then it affect the species. For the above result population is measure factor, so it needs to be control.

OBSERVATION OF FARMERS DAY:

On 23rd Dec 2009 Farmers Day observed to create awareness among the villagers about



New technology under project READ (Rural Education on Agriculture Development) An conference was organized in the village of Pendoria block Bhetwa Sultanpur. On this Day our volunteer tells that Pusha has research an hydro gel crystal under the name Kaveri which is mixed with seeds during the sowing in the fields. It decreases the farmer's irrigation economy and decreases the fertilizers cost by 50% in the farmers field. It also increases the productivity by 30%. SAHASH organized Farmers Day to raise awareness among the farming community about recently developed rice varieties, hybrids and technologies .About 100 farmers from various villages participated in the programme.

OBSERVATION OF NATIONAL CONSUMER DAY:

On 24th Dec 2009 National Consumers Day was celebrated as Consumer Awareness Program and campaign as *Jago Grahak Jago (Wake up consumer, wake up.)* in different villages to aware the villagers about Consumer Protection Act, 1986, which has the objective of providing cheap, simple and quick justice to consumers. The government has intensified its consumer education initiatives by highlighting issues such as maximum retail price (MRP), labeling and standardization. We alerted the villagers while purchasing golden jewelries make sure that it has hallmark and they should take receipts from shopkeepers. We also alerted them while purchasing the utensils or any other item, check the ISI mark & while purchasing the salt, ghee, spices, oils & other food materials to check Ag. Mark.

We also told them that if their electricity bills, water, bills, irrigation bills of canals came without using it, they have right to file an application under District Consumer Court where no fee is required for this application or lawyer to file it. Only an application is sufficient to get their rights and by it they can demand compensation for it. By this way many of villagers have become able to know the rights and they filed much application in consumer court regarding their issues & problems, which they are facing from the government offices.

OBSERVATION OF FARMERS CONFERENCE:



On 1st Jan 2010 Farmers Conference was observed to create awareness among the villagers about new schemes of state and central government for them.

In conference was organized in the village of Bhadar block Bhadar Sultanpur. On this Day our volunteer tells about national food security mission under which agricultural tool is provided to the farmers and Krishi Yantrikaran Yojana. To take the profit of Krishi Yantrikaran Yojana, preference is given to small farmers, SC/ST and 30% reserved for women farmers. In this conference our co-coordinator told the farmers not show the seed of sugarcane COSE-92423 because during crushing of sugarcane, juice is minimum and waste is more. He also told them about he varieties of rice such as CSR10 (Plant height is 85 cm and Maturity duration is 120 days), CSR23 (Plant height is 115cm and Maturity duration is 130days).

OBSERVATION OF ROAD SAFETY WEEK:



On 10th Jan 2010 Road Safety week was observed to create awareness among the students and villagers which are beside the roads. Our volunteer told the villagers about the rules to cross the road and walk aside the road on your right side. They also told that not to drive when you used an alcohol that may cause an accident due to misbalance of your position. They also told that not to use mobile phone while driving a vehicle and wear a helmet on head which help you from any head injury cause by sudden misbalance of vehicle.
