Mission and Vision:

SAHASH is a non-profit organization with a mission to think, promise and work together within India to achieve a lasting improvement in the quality of life of the poor. SAHASH is dedicated to the betterment of society; Economically, Educationally and culturally. To achieve the goal SAHASH deals in the fields of Child Protection & Education, Human Rights & Humanity, Rural Development, Health Care, Women Empowerment, Environmental Conservation, and Agriculture. To work for deprived people for their upliftment and betterment with special emphasis on children, farmers and women and to provide them with livelihood opportunities and bring them into the mainstream of society.

Introduction:

We began in 2006 as small a organization in a village Munshiganj, Tehsil of Amethi, District: Amethi Uttar Pradesh (India) with a small vocational centre for women and girls. Now SAHASH has grown to be the provider of permanent supportive educational services in rural villages for children of age 2-5 years with model, charts and toys. Also provide training to farmers for self-employment in irrespective of gender and promote them to cultivate the medicinal plants. We have trained more than 1500 women/girls to overcome physical disability, unemployment, and the barriers of poverty. We provide innovative and creative solutions to help women achieve their goals through our award-winning programs and services. Our programmes are Handicrafts promotion, self-Employment promotion, Farmers training, Continuing Education for old, Awareness camps like Health, Environment, Road Safety, Bonded Labour and Women awareness. Beyond this work for the Leprosy affected people, Schedule Caste, Schedule Tribes, and homeless people for shelter. SAHASH main objective is to help poor, dalits and aware for the rights. SAHASH work for backward community and their development with educationally - culturally.

Coverage Area of Society:

SAHASH working all over India but limited to the programs. SAHASH Working in the villages-Munshiganj, SarayKhema, Dandupur, Teri, Katramaharani, Matiyar Bagura, Dandupur of Block Amethi, Pendoria, Thaura, Kurmikapurwa, Bhetwa, Tikri, Katergaon of Block Bhetwa, Tandwa, Nehrepur, Gartholia, Ujjaini of block Shahgargh, Bhadar of District- Amethi. SAHASH also work outside these Blocks where basic amenities are required such as food rich in vitamins and proteins, clothing, housing, fresh water and health. These are not accessible for target groups. Many people are fighting for basics like food, house. We have to aware them about Education Health and Laws -Rights. Now expanded work outside Noida (Uttar Pradesh), Kurukshetra (Haryana), North-East Delhi (Delhi).

Main activities of the organization:



1. Voter Awareness Campaign: On 13 April it was observed with the objective of increasing voter turnout in the 2024 Lok Sabha General Elections, under the direction of District Election Officer/District Magistrate Nisha Anant and Chief Development Officer/Officer-in-Charge SVEEP Suraj Patel, a Mehndi and Rangoli competition was organized at Mahatma Shiv Kumar Inter College, Dharaimafi, in Bhetua block, under the SVEEP program, as per the orders of Dr. Aradhana Raj, Deputy Director of Nehru Yuva Kendra Amethi, and under the leadership of Er. Lalmani Kashyap, founder of the Society for Animal Health, Agriculture Science and Humanity. In the Mehndi competition, Poornima Kashyap secured the first position, Manisha the second, and Divyanshi the third. In the Rangoli competition, Aarti Pal secured the first position, Khushi

the second, and Komal Soni the third. All the participants were honored with medals and certificates by the college principal, Kailash Nath Upadhyay. Mrs. Anju Tiwari, Vijay Kumar Yadav, Rakesh Kumar Yadav, Shyam Lal Shukla, Abhishek Pandey, and other teachers were present.

At the primary school in Dharamafi, Bhetua block, under the chairmanship of Principal Mrs. Kusum Lata Kuril, students expressed their views on how voting strengthens democracy, and voter awareness pamphlets were distributed to the children. Mrs. Nisha Yadav was also present on this occasion.

A Mehndi competition was also organized at Dr. Pushendra Memorial Post Graduate College, Paschim Duara. In the Mehndi competition, Archana secured the first position, Shweta the second, and Richa the third. A rally was also organized on this occasion. All the young people were given pamphlets and took an oath to go door-to-door to raise awareness among people about voting on May 20th in Amethi and to conduct intensive voter awareness campaigns in their respective villages. 2. Education Programme: On 29 April 2024 Society for Animal Health, Agriculture Science and Humanity launches Practical Internship Program for BSc Biology Students at Maharishi University, Noida. Organization working in the field of social service and education, has formally launched a practical internship program for BSc Biology students of Maharishi

University of Information Technology, Noida campus, through its partner Metro Care Path Lab, Noida. The objective of this internship program is to provide students with practical experience so that they can directly understand medical testing, biological research, and laboratory work. During this internship at Metro Care Path Lab, Noida, students were introduced to modern laboratory equipment and techniques.

Dr. Sanjeev Kumar, Health Coordinator of SAHASH, said that this effort is a significant step towards strengthening the future of the students. They were also made aware of the symptoms of anemia, malaria, dengue, thyroid problems, jaundice, and diabetes. The university administration and the student community have welcomed this initiative.



3.Environment Awareness programme: On 5th June 2024, To spread awareness about environmental protection, a tree plantation program was organized in Panga village of Gauriganj block and Sonari village of Bhadar block, under the leadership of Abhay Sharma, President Yova Mandal. Abhay Kumar planted saplings of plants like Tulsi, Palm, Chandni, and Aloe Vera in pots and pledged to protect nature and the environment. The program highlighted the ill effects of the severe heatwave sweeping across the

country and warned that if environmental protection is neglected, the coming times will be even more difficult for human life. Decided that the condition of the trees planted this year would be reviewed periodically. All the participants pledged to protect the environment and felt proud to contribute to preserving nature.



4. Successful story of Women Empowerment: On 7th June 2024. A Star Rises from the Village Soil: An Inspiring Story of Empowerment of Sangeeta Prajapati — a courageous and determined young woman from a small village in Amethi district of Uttar Pradesh, who dared to dream beyond her limitations. preservation techniques, modern packaging and hygiene standards, and essential micro-entrepreneurship skills. Today, Sangeeta not only runs her own small-scale food processing unit but has also achieved financial independence by professionally packaging local products. Most importantly, she has become an inspiration for other women in her village. Her story is proof that when opportunity and determination meet, nothing is impossible. Rural women are not lacking in potential — they simply need the right guidance and support. Let us all celebrate the power of skills, self-reliance, and local entrepreneurship.
